Engage the Word of God

I was thinking about how important it is for us to engage God's word. What do I mean by that? The dictionary defines 'engage' as: to participate or become involved in

How do we do that?

It begins with hearing or reading. But James tells us in the book of James not to be a hearer only, but a doer (James 1:22). And surely engaging, participating and being involved is more than just knowing what the Word says.

Heb. 4:12 "For the word of God is living and active..." Some translations say living and powerful!

God's Word is alive, right now! It is full of life, active and has power, amen. We're not engaging lifeless words on a page, but the eternal words of the creator of the universe!

When we think of Salvation, it is the WORD of salvation that we heard and engaged by believing! When that happened, we became born-again of the Spirit of God. His Spirit came to live in us and changed us. That's the power and effectiveness of God's word when we engage it!!

God's Word, whether it be for healing, deliverance, prosperity, your identity in Christ, the love of God for you....needs to be engaged!

His Words are as alive and are spoken to us right now as much as when they were written. When we hear the Word of God, we have the opportunity to participate in it, and become involved with it-to engage it.

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When you read the stories in the Gospels, How would you respond if Jesus was speaking those words to you? Would you respond to Him? Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:8) The next time you hear the word being preached, or read, don't just listen, but engage God through that word! Experience the life giving power of it.

Questions to help you know if you are engaging the Word of God

1. Do I understand the meaning of what is being said?
2. Do I see this word as a word specifically for me?
3. How can I apply this word to my life?
3. What is my response to God about that word?
4. Am I meditating on that word after I have read it?

If you don't understand what is being said, do a small word study by looking that word up and seeing what the Greek/Hebrew meaning is or other scriptures where this word is being used. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to give you understanding and show you how that word can be applicable to you. Be expectant that God will speak to you through His Word and continue to meditate on it afterward. Engage God through His word! Build your relationship with God by what He says! And Respond.

Jesus came to make God known to the world. If you've seen Him, you've seen the

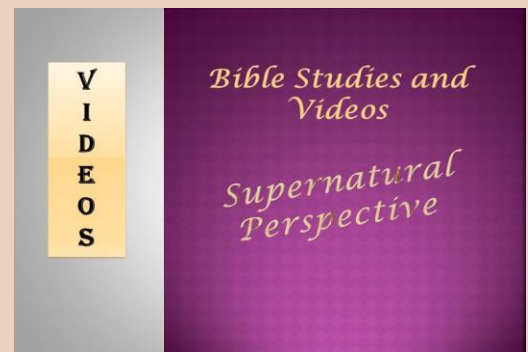

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Our view of Scripture—particularly how we view the Bible’s authenticity and authority in our lives—profoundly affects our spiritual formation. For this reason, the primary thing we should know about the Bible is that, “All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work” (2 Timothy 3:16-17) Knowing facts about the Bible is not for the purpose of gathering material for a trivia contest, but for becoming intimately familiar with the book that will most shape our lives.

Did you know?



The Bible is a library of 66 books, written by over 40 different authors under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit over a period of about 1500 years. The word “Bible” is an English word derived from the Greek ‘ta biblia’ meaning ‘the books.’ In its literal sense it means scroll which came to be used as the ordinary word for ‘book.’ The first five books of the Bible is called Pentateuch, meaning five books and was written by Moses. (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy). The word “testament” means covenant. The term “Old Testament” refers to the covenant that God entered into with Abraham and the people of Israel, and the “New Testament” to the covenant God has entered into with believers through Christ. There are 39 books of the Old Testament and 27 books of the New Testament. All but 3 Old Testament books (Esther, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon) are quoted or referenced in the New Testament. Chapters and verses were not part of the original writings, but added centuries later for convenience. The term “scripture” means writings. Bible authors refer to the Old and New Testament writings as Holy Scriptures.

Isaiah 26:3 You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you.

He will never leave you or forsake you.

Deuteronomy 31:8 The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.

He has good plans for you.

Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

He has healed you.

1 Peter 2:24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed.

He will give you wisdom.

James 1:5 If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.

He will meet your needs.

Philippians 4:19 And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.

He will deliver you from your troubles.

Psalms 34:17 The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles.

He will give you the desires of your heart.

Psalms 37:4 Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

The Bible is full of the promises of God for His children. All of them are yes and amen to His glory by us! (see 2 Corinthians 1:20)

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Bible Character Synopsis

Moses-Hebrew baby, prince in Egypt, Shepherd for 40 years, lead the Israelites out of bondage in Egypt, becomes mediator between God and the Israelites.

David-shepherd boy, fights Goliath, banished by Saul and lived on the run, becomes king of Israel. A man after God's own heart.

Joseph-11th son of Jacob, sold into slavery by brothers, becomes 2nd in command over Egypt and saves the nation during a famine and the dream God gave him years before of his brothers bowing before him comes to pass.

Romans 8:28 and we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.

Lesson to glean: God sees in you what He made you for. While He does not send the bad as a trial or test, He works it toward His ultimate goal of promoting you and putting you into the purposes He has for you. During trials and tests, we need to stay faithful to God and allow patience to develop our character so that we will be ready.

Psalm 34:7 Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart.

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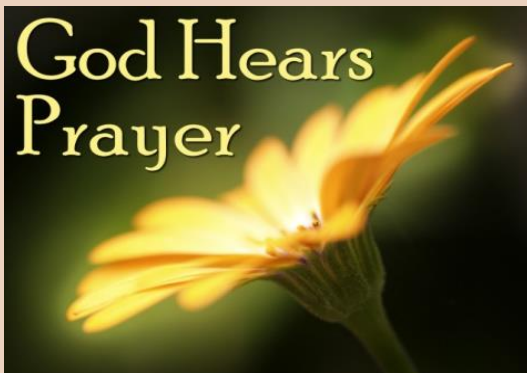
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Letter to Subscriber

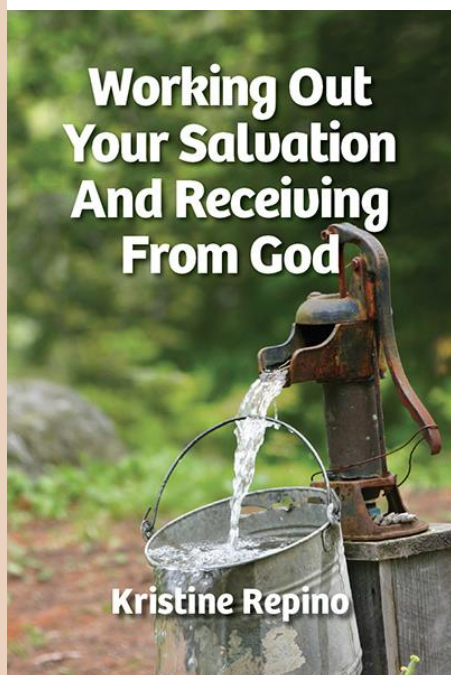
